The Paris School of Psychosomatics developed an original thought and new concepts to understand and think about the psychosomatic unit that defines each human being. In line with psychoanalytic thinking and theory, in the 1950s Pierre Marty, Michel de M'Uzan, Christian David and Michel Fain worked together and created the Paris School of Psychosomatics and its linked clinical unit, The Institute of Psychosomatics (Paris 13). This theoretical line develops Freud's preliminary concepts that allowed a new perception of illness. It differs from the psychosomatic medicine that tries to search how psychic factors have an impact on somatic events. The first writings of The Paris School of Psychosomatics explored the weakness of neurotic defense mechanisms in patients who get ill. These illnesses do not have symbolic meanings, but are rather fostered by the failure of psychic defense mechanisms and elaboration, a lack of fantasies, of dreams, of neurotic symptoms, etc.

The "mentalisation" quality is fragile and the psychic functioning variable.
